5. Update on High Plains Economic Development District.

Karen Guidice, Executive Director of the Southeast Wyoming Economic Development District provided the Board with an update of activities specific to Albany County this past year. A new website has been set up and has had up to 3,500 to 4,000 hits per month and contains Albany County information. The District also received a grant from the Wyoming Workforce Development Council to assist the oil and gas industry with workforce development. SWEDD also received a \$100,000 grant for consulting fees to determine gaps and broadband needs in southeast Wyoming.

David Gertsch, Planning Director spoke to the board regarding these proposed amendments to the City of Laramie Comprehensive Plan. There is no recommendation from the Planning & Zoning because it was a tie vote.

Charles Bloom, City Planner gave an overview of the 156 unit apartment complex. He indicated that there will need to be a city development review and a traffic study. Upon annexation to the City, they would have to follow the standards set by them regarding the impacts to the aquifer.


