2. Wyoming's Joint Symposium on Children & Youth scholarships are available through the Victim Witness Program of the Albany County & Prosecuting Attorney's Office. Please email Peggy Trent and Maria Consuelos if you would like to receive a registration scholarship by this Friday, April 13, 2018. The Subcommittee also discussed and was encouraged to attend the Free Workshop: Understanding Reactive Attachment Disorder at the University of Wyoming on April 17, 2018 at 6:00pm-8:00pm.
3. The Board was in receipt of the final Restorative Justice Protocol. Maria will send out the Word version of the Protocol to the Subcommittee. Please provide feedback to Peggy Trent by April 16, 2018. The updated Restorative Justice Protocol with feedbacks will be available at the next Subcommittee meeting. The Subcommittee also discussed the two restorative justice conferences that were held. The Subcommittee discussed that they would like to find funding for a neutral facilitator to arrange and facilitate these conferences. Donna Sheen and Tai Wright will look into funding options.
4. The Subcommittee was in receipt of the Juvenile Drug Court Resolution, Grant application, and notice of issuance of FY19 Funds for the Albany County Juvenile Drug Treatment Court. The grant included funds for 4 juveniles and start-up costs for the Juvenile Drug Court. Peggy Trent walked the Subcommittee through the suggested program. The Subcommittee will need determine and develop the program. Among the topics that will need to be included in protocols for the program are the following: goal; outcomes; referral of juveniles of treatment; participants and their roles (develop written MOU for information sharing), location of treatment; treatment component; education component, and family involvement. The Subcommittee discussed splitting up sections between Subcommittee members by their expertise. The Subcommittee was given a deadline of June 1, 2018 to complete the protocol for the Juvenile Drug Court. The Program will also hire a 20 hour individual to assist with managing the juveniles in the Juvenile Drug Court. The main role and goal of Amy Terrell's main goal and role will be to maintain the integrity of the Program the Subcommittee develops. Donna Sheen will set up a meeting with Peggy Trent to discuss the development of the Program.
5. Discussion as to subcommittee addressing issues with vaping by juveniles. Will be added to agenda at next meeting.
6. Peggy Trent, Steve Hamaker, Donna Sheen and Ty Peterson to discuss Single Point of Entry training.
7. The Subcommittee discussed that as part of the development of the Juvenile Drug Court Program, the Subcommittee needs to outline the intake process for SPOE. The Subcommittee also discussed looking into hiring an Intake Coordinator for SPOE.

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Day 1

Featuring Zackary Adams, Ph.D.

Dr. Adams is an Assistant Professor and licensed health service provider in psychology in the Indiana University Department of Psychiatry. His clinical and research interests center on improving care and promoting healthy outcomes for young people with co-occurring mental health and substance use problems, with a particular emphasis on youth and families impacted by trauma and adversity. Additionally, he is strongly committed to teaching students, interns, residents, fellows and involving trainees in all aspects of his team's work. Much of his research falls into two broad categories. His first set of projects focuses on refining our understanding of how co-occurring mental health problems develop in childhood and adolescence, particularly among youth exposed to violence, disasters, and other traumatic and adverse events. His teams accomplish this through a variety of methods ranging from laboratory-based studies investigating neurocognitive and psychosocial mechanisms associated with mental health and substance use problems to large-scale epidemiological surveys characterizing how common certain experiences are and what factors are associated with those experiences. His second set of projects involves developing and testing new intervention models (such as therapies that target multiple problems in an integrative fashion) and technology-based tools (mobile applications, web-based platforms) to make mental health treatments more efficient, accessible, and effective for youth and families. Dr. Adams is currently supported through an NIH/NIDA Career Development Award ([5K23DA038257](#); M-Health Tools to Enhance Treatment of Teen Substance Use and Mental Illness). Dr. Adams' clinical interests include evidence-based psychotherapy for child and adolescent mental health problems, Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT), adolescent substance use treatment, and integrated treatments for co-occurring psychiatric and substance use disorders. Dr. Adams is a TF-CBT Certified therapist.

Dr. Adams will focus his presentation on foundational knowledge of trauma in children, the difference between trauma and PTSD, how trauma impacts children of all ages at school, and the current understanding of evidence-based practices for trauma in the schools. Dr. Adams' presentation will set the stage for Days 2 and 3 of our conference.

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Day 2 and 3

Featuring Carla Danielson, Ph.D.

Dr. Danielson is a professor and director of the Invictus Lab at the National Crime Victims Research and Treatment Center (NCVC) in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Science at the Medical University of South Carolina. Her research interests focus on treatment and prevention with high-risk adolescent and traditionally underserved populations, including basic and translational science studies that inform such applied clinical research. In the area of treatment, her current program of research, funded by a NIDA R01 award (R01DA031285), involves the evaluation of Risk Reduction through Family Therapy (RRFT), an ecologically-based intervention targeting substance abuse, trauma-related psychopathology, and HIV-risk behaviors among adolescent trauma victims. In the area of prevention, Dr. Danielson is the PI and Program Director on the SAMHSA-funded EMPOWERR Program (1U79SP015156), which focuses on prevention of HIV and substance abuse among local ethnic minority adolescents. She serves as PI on an NIAAA-funded Alcohol Research Center Clinical Research Component (P50 AA010761; Center PI: Becker), which is a 5-year lab-based study, examining the relation between acute stress and drinking behavior in trauma and non-trauma exposed emerging adults, as well as an NIMH-funded study (R21MH086313) focusing on the identification of mechanisms underlying the development of PTSD, substance abuse, and other high risk behaviors among disaster-exposed teens. Finally, Dr. Danielson is actively involved in the training of future researchers, mentoring NCVC predoctoral and postdoctoral fellows and serving as Training Director and Co-PI on a T32 grant (T32MH18869-27). Dr. Danielson is a national trainer for Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT).

Dr. Danielson's presentation will focus on TF-CBT. Participants will leave this conference skilled at using TF-CBT in their practice with children in the schools and in clinical settings. Participants will also have the option to pursue certification in TF-CBT with Dr. Danielson herself. More information for certification will be presented at the conference.
