Regular Meeting
February 01, 2021**

Mayor Pro Tem Skip Voss called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Roll Call: council members present were Scott White and Lana Clark. Bobbie Bowers was not present. A quorum was established. Everyone stood and said the pledge of allegiance. Employees present were Chief water operator Rick Stricklin, Maintenance Man Eric Clark and Treasurer Jody Gallegos

White made a motion to accept the January 04, 2021 regular meeting minutes, seconded by Clark, all ayes, motion carried.

Maintenance Department Report:

Clark made a motion to accept the maintenance report as presented, seconded by White, all ayes, motion carried. Copies of the report are available in the clerk's office.

Unfinished Business:

Voss read ordinance 19-205 sewer tap fees by title. Clark made a motion to accept the third and final reading of ordinance 19-205, seconded by White, all ayes, motion carried.

Voss read ordinance 25-612 by title. White made a motion to accept the third and final reading of ordinance 25-612, seconded by Clark, all ayes, motion carried.

Voss read ordinance 18-204 dumpster rental fees by title. Clark made a motion to accept the third and final reading of ordinance 18-204, seconded by White, all ayes, motion carried.

There was no more unfinished business.

New Business:

There were no building permits.

Voss opened the bids for new flooring in the Town hall. There were 4 bids. They each bid on 3 options, all new carpet, all new luxury vinyl tile and all carpet squares. The tally was as follows:

- Coulthard Construction: carpet – \$38,767.00, carpet squares – \$44,075.00, LVT – \$46,483.00
- Commercial Flooring of Laramie: Carpet - \$16,588.00, carpet squares - \$21,477.00, LVT - \$44,727.00
- Rick Allbritton II: Carpet - \$17,937.64, carpet squares - \$24,770.14, LVT - \$43,831.50
- Two Mountain constr.: Carpet - \$43,060.81, carpet squares - \$34,004.72, LVT - \$31,310.49

White made a motion to not accept these bids, seconded by Clark, all ayes, motion carried. He stated that there was some confusion with putting this project out for bid and so for fairness, the council will schedule a special meeting and nail down the specifics of what they want and re-bid the job.

Voss reminded the council that the town hall will be closed on Monday February 15 for Presidents Day.

Voss read ordinance 27-101 to restrict ground mosquito fogging to town limits.

ORDINANCE: 27-101

INTRODUCED BY: Council

ORDINANCE TO AMEND 27-101
MOSQUITO FEES.

SECTION 1: BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF ROCK RIVER:

SECTION 2. Effective April 5, 2021, section 1 of chapter 1 of Title 27, Mosquitos, shall read as follows: The term “consumer” as used in this Ordinance shall be held to mean the property owner or his agent, each individual user including each business, trailer, apartment, home or other residence of any kind, within the town limit. Whenever used in this Ordinance; the person responsible for the payment of all charges shall be the consumer and all bills will be rendered in his name. This shall apply to ground fogging only, arial spraying shall continue in the outer lying areas.

Clark made a motion to accept the first reading of ordinance 27-101, seconded by White, all ayes, motion carried.
